

OPEN, REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS & SA CHAMPIONSHIPS

2023

1. Regional U13 and U15 tournament

- a) Hosting province to run the tournament and to appoint their own tournament referee.
- b) Seeding will be done from accumulated Grand Prix Points. (can get from (National Junior Selector convenor) and will be updated on the BSA website)
- c) Hosting province can decide how to run the tournament (groups, knock out, 3 sets or 1 set to 21 points etc.) the selectors would like all games to be played, the best of three games for u15 – as this is the standard format at AA u15.
- d) Hosting province must play all three events: Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles – as per the entries received.
- e) Hosting province to supply prize money and/or trophies for winners.
- f) Hosting province to decide on prize money amount and/or trophies
- g) Hosting province to send all results to (National Junior Selector convenor) after each tournament.
- h) Plastic shuttles to be used
- i) No levies need to be paid to BSA Juniors

2. U17 and U19 Open Tournaments

- a) Hosting province to send entry from to Brenda – must have all three events: Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles.
- b) Tournament Referee is appointed by BSA Events committee
- c) Seeding will be done from accumulated Grand Prix Points (can get from (National Junior Selector convenor) and will be updated on the BSA website.
- d) Mixed Doubles is played on a Friday and Singles and Doubles played on the Saturday.
- e) Hosting province to supply prize money as per the Junior Manual. Hosting province can supply trophies if they want to.
- f) Hosting province to send all results to Emelda Botha (National Junior Selector convenor)
- g) Feather Shuttles to be used.
- h) Levies will need to be paid to BSA Juniors – BSA Juniors – will supply an invoice to hosting province

3. SA Inter Provincial Tournaments, U13, U15, U17 and U19

The SA Inter Provincial Tournaments must be played FIRST, followed by the SA Individual Championships.

4. Inter Provincial Tournament Format: U13, U15, U17 and U19:

Group Stage, Play off and then Final, or if there is not enough teams to warrant a group stage, we will play Round robin, this will be decided once we receive all the team entries.

5. SA Individual Championships U9, U11 and U13

- a) SA u9 and U11 – knock out and/or round robin – depending on entries
- b) SA U13 – knock out with consolation
- c) U9 players can play in both U9 events and u11 events.
- d) U11 players can play in both U11 events and U13 events.

6. SA Individual Championships U15, U17 and U19

Knock out plus consolation
